


Highlight of the Week:

Manufacturing data and trade worries spark sell-off

- The Institute for Supply Management announced US manufacturing activity contracted more than expected in November
- Rhetoric around US-China trade raises concerns deal will not be signed before key December 15th deadline

Rapid Report:

Atlanta businesswoman expected to be named Georgia US Senator

- Gov. Brian Kemp told GOP leaders he will pick Kelly Loeffler to be interim senator, despite staunch objections by President Trump
- The seat has opened since Sen. Johnny Isakson announced he will step-down at year end due to health concerns
- Trump had recommended a strong backer, Doug Collins, for the interim post

Chinese government increases government facial recognition control

- Chinese citizens registering for new mobile-phone services will now have to scan their faces to verify identifies moving forward
- The requirement aims to minimize telephone fraud and prevent the selling and transferring of mobile-phone cards
- Concerns grow as facial recognition powers the centralization of population oversight
